

## 2023 - 2024 FINANCIAL AID STUDENT BUDGETS (Cost of Attendance)

The following standard student budgets (Cost of Attendance) have been accepted for the use of the college in determining student's *financial need*.

Cost of Attendance minus Expected Family Contribution (EFC) = financial need

Once a student meets all the eligibility requirements for financial aid, the Financial Aid Department will determine how much financial aid a student can receive based on a student's *financial need* and the availability of funds.
